Factors Affecting Postwar Relations

- Wartime experiences: invasion of China, colonization of Korea, breach of the neutrality pact by the USSR.
- Cold War relations
- Relations with third parties
- Relative economic and cultural strength

The strength of Japan's bargaining position has weakened considerably since the 1980s.

Domestic Factors

- China: Deep internal divisions. Tension in Sino-Japanese relations results from a mixture of legitimate grievances and political expediency (generating national unity).
- Korea:The vital role of the Korean War (north vs south, resisters vs collaborators, communists vs capitalists). Korea divided while Japan benefitted economically: a very bitter pill to swallow ...
- Russia/USSR: Indifference to Japan. Russia got what it wanted during the war (Sakhalin, the Kuriles).

Why Little Islands Matter

- National pride: Victory in the territory issue = Victory in the history issue.
- Blood sacrifice: Never give away territory that people have died to gain.
- Economics: Ocean resources in the Exclusive Economic Zone
- Strategic Importance: Naval passage to the open seas; control of sea lanes.
